*A PIC is required to report when it has made expenditures totaling \$750 for the calendar year or received contributions totaling \$750 for the calendar year. Please see §20A-11-802 for more details on PIC disclosure filings.

*A county party is required to file a Year End report if it has made expenditures totaling \$50 for the calendar year or received contributions totaling \$750 for the calendar year. Please see §20A-11-510 for more details.
